 - Alfred Stieglitz's art gallery 291 (1906)
 - The "Armory Show" (1913) publicizes the European avantgarde
 - Synchromism (1913) is the first movement of abstract painting
 - Gallery of Living Art at NYU (1927) is exclusively devoted to contemporary art
 - Museum of Modern Art (1929)
 - Exodus of talents from Germany after Nazism disbands the Bauhaus (1933)
 - Surrealists relocate to New York after Nazist occupation of Paris (1941)





Precisionism

- Futurism + Cubism + monumental celebration of the city ("cubist realism")
- Painting of industrial architecture (factories, bridges, etc)
- Mass production as a national epic
- "Spiritual control over the machine" (Paul Strand)
- Similar to New Objectivity, opposite to Constructivism
- Classicizing the machine








